Travel to the Denver Airport from the Hotel: What You Need to Know

Note: The Denver Airport is one of the busiest airports in the world! As such, the security lines are often very long, but they do move quickly! Give yourself plenty of time to make it through airport security and allow for highway traffic or train delays in your trip planning.

There are two main options for transportation back to the Denver Airport:

- 1. Rideshare
 - Request a Rideshare (Uber/Lyft) to the Denver Airport be prepared to know what airline you're flying so the driver can drop you off at the correct terminal
- 2. The A Line commuter train, operated by the Regional Transportation District (RTD)
 - Walk or request a Rideshare (Uber/Lyft) to Union Station
 - Travel time: 37 minutes from Denver Union Station to DEN
 - Frequency: trains run every 15 minutes during peak travel times, and every 30 minutes from 3 a.m. - 5 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. to 1 a.m. (for exact departure and arrival times, please consult the schedule on the <u>RTD website</u>)
 - Tickets: A Line tickets may be purchased using cash or credit cards at the ticket vending machines located at the train stations.
 - Fare: the airport fare is \$10.50 per day from any of the stations along the A Line and includes unlimited rides on the A Line during a single business day and well as serving as a Regional pass should you desire to go elsewhere
 - Note: Taking the A Line commuter train is *easy*! Simply get on the A Line commuter train and ride it until the route ends at the Denver Airport.
